BAY AREA AND BEYOND with MAURY HATCH

While many of us are still nervous about airline travel, what better time to consider a drive to our neighbors in the North. Fall season caters to all tastes from saltwater to fresh, and few people know the area better than our October presenter, Maury Hatch.

Maurice Richard Hatch was born in Marin County, CA and moved to Sacramento with his family when he was 4 years old. As the third child of four, he was always interested in animals of all kinds. His first love was birds, and then reptiles, before finally focusing on fish at the age of 15. He was fortunate enough to have a grandfather that had a private bass pond in the foothills of Northern California. He was influenced by his grandfather and uncles who were avid fishermen of bass and trout. As a senior in high school, he was introduced to fly fishing by some close friends. After that, he was hooked and decided to forget conventional fishing and only pursue fish on the fly. He also had careers as a ski instructor/coach and restaurant manager as well as racing road bikes before focusing his full-time attention on guiding. Maury has been fly fishing the western United

States and Mexico for 35+ years. After honing his skills with trout, he hooked his first Striped Bass in 1995, and has been chasing, catching, and releasing stripers ever since. As a Captain, he guides both out of the San Joaquin Delta in a



center console bay boat in the fall and spring, and then on a jet sled on the Feather and the American Rivers in the summer for stripers, Small Mouth Bass and shad. All trips include top-ofthe-line equipment as well as custom-tied flies. Maury is also an ambassador level, pro-staffer for the following products: Costa sunglasses, Simms clothing, Sage rods, RIO lines and Galvan reels. He is the Co-event Manager for the Costa Bass-N-Fly Tournament and annually hosts trips to Baja with Gary Bulla, and at Tarpon Cay Lodge in the Yucatan and Christmas Island.

So, on Saturday I rose at 4:00 AM and headed down the highway to join fly fishing friends, Lino Jubilado, Analiza del Rosario and new friend Dinah White at Lino's favorite spot. We crawled down a rough concrete embankment in the early morning mist, to wade into the murky, smelly LA River along with 100 or so birds and water fowl. I had a feeling that this day was my day to catch and land a carp, and I managed, with lots of encouragement from my friends, to get the job done on my second cast. WILDFIRES, TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS, MANY SETBACKS

As fly fishers, we've been adapting to the Covid pandemic by restricting travel, limiting group meetings, and adjusting to social demands within a divergent country during an election year. It gets taxing (pun intended!).

The last two months has been another record season for wildfires within California. Most of these wildfires start naturally through lightning strikes and this year we have been struck over 12,000 times. Just as the travel restrictions were being lifted from Covid, the wildfires have limited us from fishing many of our favorite streams and



lakes. These fires have burned over 2.5 million acres in California and we still have another month of "fire season" ahead of us.

It has personally impacted me as the SQF fire came within a ½ mile of my cabin and burned almost all of my favorite local fishing sites. I had to cancel two fishing trips to the Kings River and the Upper Kern. The pack station I use for the Upper Kern lost two major buildings and will be closed the rest of the season. This is a minor setback for me when I realize how many thousands have lost their homes due to these fires and it has cost many lives as well.

HEALTHY FORESTS = HEALTHY CLIMATE

Fire has been a natural occurrence within the Sierra. It is estimated that a fire occurrence every 11 years existed within all of the acreage of the Sierra Nevada prior to 1850. These were low intensity fires that allowed older trees to survive and cleared the forest floor of litter for good seedling regeneration. Today, we have high intensity fires which have not burned many of our acres for over 100 years. Our forests and streams are not adapted to this change. Trees are lost and streams fill with sedimentation.

Part of the problem is global warming, our carbon dioxide levels have reached levels that the earth experienced during volcanic periods. A TU report shows that by 2080, we will have an increase of almost 9 degrees within the Sierra



Nevada and will lose about 50% of our cutthroats in the Rocky Mountains. The other problem is management of our federal forestland which controls about 90% of the Sierra Nevada.

Our forests have become dense, slow growing, and weak. Bark Beetles killed over 25 million trees over the last few years within California. Our forests, rather than being a "carbon sink" has become a net "carbon submitter". More carbon is passed into our atmosphere by these wildfires in one year than over a decade of carbon saving programs that have been in place. Both of these problems need to be addressed and considered. We need to maintain a healthy forest to maintain a healthy climate. We cannot continue to allow our forests to convert into chaparral communities.

Get your room reservations in Bishop or enjoy some of the available camping sites nearby. We will have an award dinner afterwards at the Fairgrounds. In addition, we are planning some fly fishing workshops featuring local guides on Sunday.


